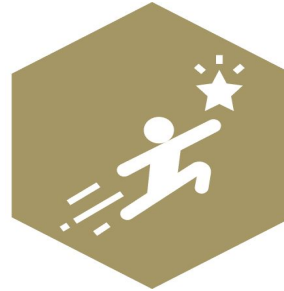

60 dollars = *1 hour*

There are *168* hours in one week

Academic Time in High School vs. College

High School	
Days in school	Monday – Friday (everyday)
Length of the average school day	6-7 hours
Time spent in class per week	30 – 35 hours (Monday – Friday)

College	
Days in school	Monday-Saturday (days vary)
Length of school day	Varies (1-4 classes a day on average)
Time spent in class per week	12 – 15 hours on average (credit hours)
Learning hours outside of class	10 – 30 hours (based on Charlotte trends)



Academic Transitions

- Class sizes may be significantly larger
- More independence / self-direction required
- Syllabus outlines entire semester
- Classes meet less frequently
- Larger amounts of material to cover
- Perhaps fewer graded assignments and tests
