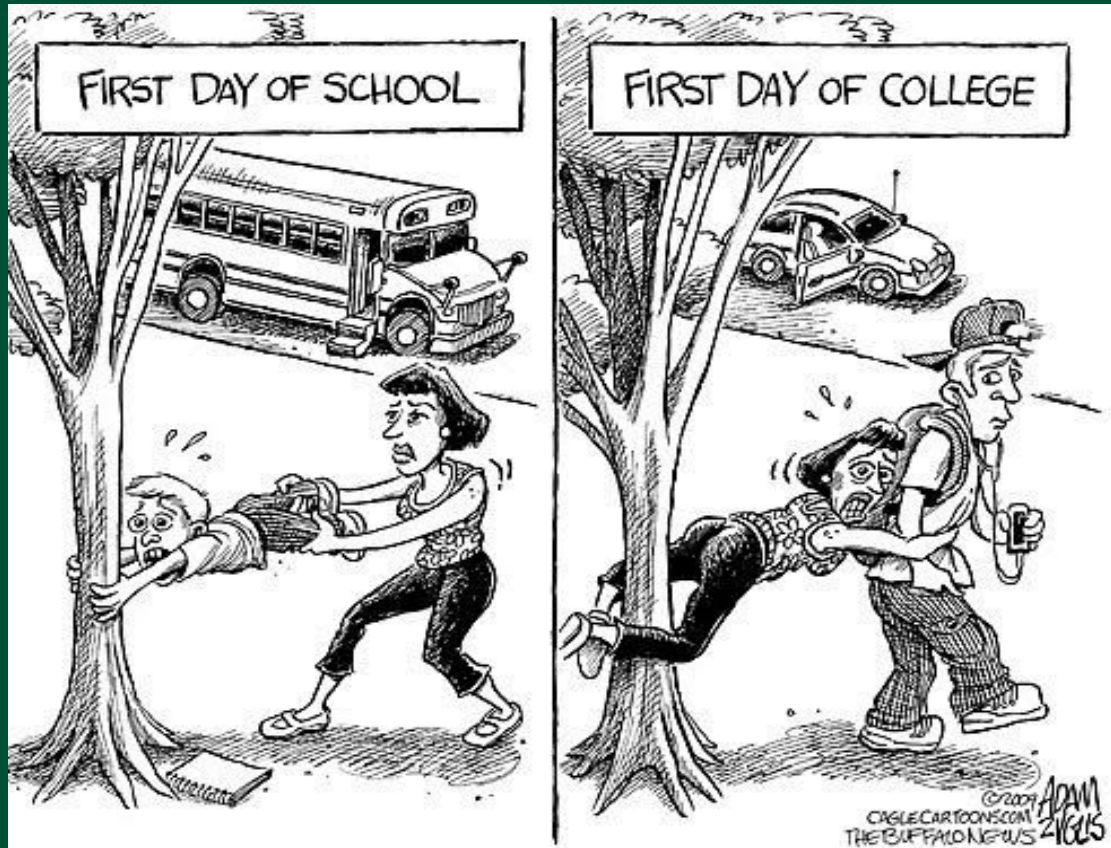

A **transition** is a time of change when your student moves from one college experience to another. Even though they've been in college before, transferring brings new routines, new people, and a new environment to **adjust to**. It's a chance to learn, grow, and find a fresh start.





	Before UNC Charlotte	At UNC Charlotte
Academics	Students may have followed a structured curriculum or had flexibility depending on the institution.	Transfer students must evaluate how previous credits apply to their new major. Academic advising is key to course planning and timely graduation.
Grades	Academic performance may have been shared more openly, especially at smaller institutions or with family support.	Student records, including grades, are protected by the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA). Parents/family members are not privy to their student's grades without their written consent.
Textbooks	Textbook policies vary. Some institutions may provide them, others require purchase/rental.	Students must purchase/rent textbooks for their classes.
Attendance	Attendance policies may have been closely monitored, especially at smaller schools or in developmental courses.	Attendance policies vary and not every professor will take attendance. Parents/family members will not be notified if students don't attend class.
Class Size	Class sizes could vary, often smaller at community colleges or larger at some universities.	Charlotte classes range widely in size. Transfer students may encounter both large lectures and intimate seminars depending on their program.
Time Management & Prioritizing	Time may have been structured by advisors, professors, or family. External responsibilities may have varied.	Transfer students must manage their time independently while adjusting to a new campus culture and expectations. Prioritization is critical to success.

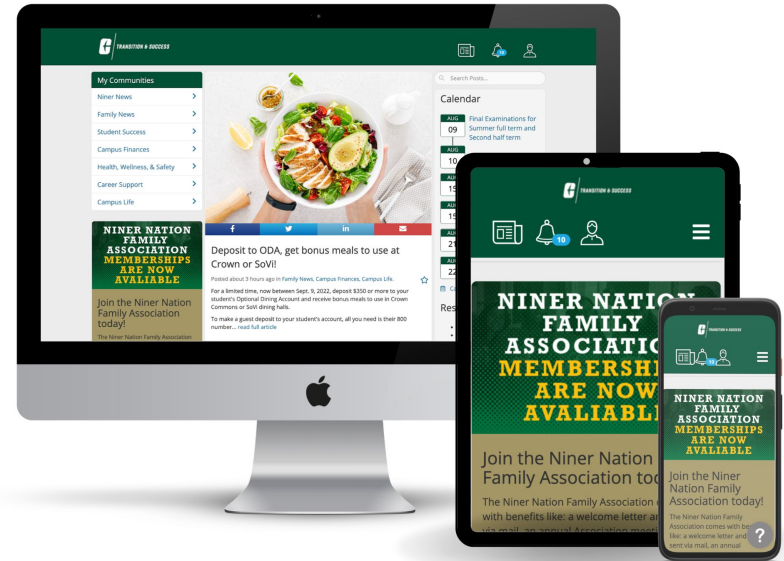
